





Blyton Named Parliamentarian

Dr. Gifford Blyton University debate coach, was appointed Wednesday by President John Oswald, to serve as the first parliamentarian of the University Faculty organiza-

1963 - President Oswald originates delegation to Senate Counci Chair to preside and appoints Gifford Blyton as first Parliamentarian

### Some examples of early UK Senate Parliamentary Manuevers

Mr. Bright then presented a recommendation to amend next to the last paragraph on page two of the circularization to include the phrase "or student body" so that the paragraph will read:

> Any member of the administrative, instructional, or research staff, or student body may attend a meeting of the Senate as a visitor and may request the privilege of the floor.

The Senate defeated the proposed amendment by a vote of 61 to 30.

At this point call for a quorum was made. On question, the Parliamentarian ruled that if a quorum was not present, the preceding vote would be negated. A call was then made for a roll call of the Senators in order to determine if a quorum was present. Before the roll call could begin motion was made from the floor to adjourn. By a vote of 54 to 52 the Senate voted to adjourn the meeting.

### US: 4/28/70

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion was then made and seconded for a roll call vote. The motion for a roll call vote was disapproved.

Motion was made for a quorum call. It was determined that a quorum was present.

The Chairman then ruled that the motion to adjourn be voted on. The Senate approved that motion.

Adjournment occurred at 5:30 p.m.

## US: 12/13/71

Motion was made and seconded to close debate on the original motion as amended.

A roll call vote was called for and the Chairman overruled the motion. The Chair's ruling was challenged and the Senate voted to uphold the ruling by the Chair.

The Senate then voted for cloture.
