"The College of Nursing requests a change in the Prep and Reading Days in the University Senate approved academic calendar for students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science Nursing program. This request is made to allow for clinical experience completion as required by accrediting bodies and healthcare agency agreements. The BSN curriculum is offered in part-of-term sessions in the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Two to three required nursing courses are scheduled during each block. Typically, students are selectively admitted after completion of the pre-nursing curriculum (including UK CORE courses) during year two. Students complete major nursing courses in Traditional, Accelerated BSN, and RN to BSN tracks in three to five semesters."

<u>ADDENDUM</u>

A motion approved by the Senate Calendar Committee, 7-0-0, endorses the BSN request concerning prep days to Senate Council, with the modification of having Monday of a finals week be a prep day rather than a reading day.

"So, what is it that's being suggested?"

Briefly, there are several half-semester courses for BSN which run in the Fall and in the Spring. Associated with the half-semester courses are two weeks of final exams, one about halfway through the semester and one at the end of the semester. The current arrangement is to have a prep day on the Thursday and a reading day on the Friday of the week preceding each week of final exams. The requested arrangement is to make the Thursday and Friday normal class days but convert the Monday of the week of final exams into a prep day, with final exams taking place on Tuesday through Friday of that week. Again, they want to have two such weeks each semester, because these are half-semester courses.

Like the current arrangement, the requested arrangement entails a waiver of Senate Rule 5.2.5.6.

"Can you show me a diagram?"

Four times per year – twice in the Fall and twice in the Spring – this pattern occurs upon conclusion of half-semester BSN courses:

The Senate Rules 1) describe the University Senate's oversight of the calendar and 2) charge the Senate Council (executive body of the University Senate) with reviewing deviations from the Senate-approved calendar. In spring 2021, the University Senate approved an altered Prep and Reading Day schedule for the BSN program. The days were changed to Prep Days the Thursdays and Fridays before finals week and the Reading Day was scheduled on Fridays before finals week in each part-of-term session. We are requesting to change to a combined Prep/Reading Day on the Monday of finals week for each session.

Current University Senate approved Prep and Reading Day Schedule:

- Thursday & Friday preceding finals week in each session Prep Days
- Friday preceding finals week Reading Day

Proposed Prep and Reading Day Schedule:

Monday of finals week in each session with final exams Tuesday - Friday.

An increase in student enrollments and the need for additional clinical site access is the impetus for scheduling clinical rotations on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. A change in the Prep and Reading Days will allow clinical rotations to be completed before a Prep/Reading Day on the Monday preceding final exams for each part-of-term session.

RE: Request for modification of Academic Calendar for the BS in Nursing (BSN)

Request: The College of Nursing requests a change in the Prep and Reading Days in the University Senate approved academic calendar for students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science Nursing program. This request is made to allow for clinical experience completion as required by accrediting bodies and healthcare agency agreements.

The BSN curriculum is offered in part-of-term sessions in the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Two to three required nursing courses are scheduled during each session. Typically, students are selectively admitted after completion of the pre-nursing curriculum (including UK CORE courses) during year two. Students complete major nursing courses in Traditional, Accelerated BSN, and RN to BSN tracks in three to five semesters.

In spring 2021, the University Senate approved an altered Prep and Reading Day schedule for the BSN program. The days were changed to Prep Days the Thursdays and Fridays before finals week, and the Reading Day was changed to Fridays before finals week in each part-of-term session. We are requesting to change to a combined Prep/Reading Day on the Monday of finals week in place of the current Thursday/Friday arrangement.

Current University Senate approved Prep and Reading Day Schedule:

- Thursday & Friday preceding finals week in each session Prep Days
- Friday preceding finals week Reading Day

Proposed Prep and Reading Day Schedule:

Monday of finals week in each session with final exams on Tuesday - Friday

Rationale: The Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN), National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN), and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) by way of the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) established standards for program accreditation and student instruction that guide didactic and clinical nursing education. Completion of clinical contact hours is required before permission to engage in NCLEX testing, the licensure exam for registered nurses, is granted by the KBN and NCSBN (for out of state licensure). A minimum of 40 contact hours for each clinical credit hour are required in medical-surgical, obstetric, pediatric, public health, and psychiatric courses in our BSN program with at least 120 contact hours completed in a last semester senior practicum for pre-licensure students (KBN mandate). All non-practicum clinical courses are one credit hour except for two courses in the traditional track that are two credits. Each group of clinical students is limited to a maximum of 10 students by KBN mandate and group size may be further reduced to 6-8 students by some clinical agencies. Permission to use a clinical agency for student rotations is obtained through a Bluegrass Planning Consortium. The consortium is comprised of 12 schools of nursing and 10 hospital systems who negotiate the use of clinical areas for student experiences.

Many schools of nursing throughout the state are expanding student enrollments to honor a request by the governor to increase the nursing workforce. The dean of our college agreed to expand undergraduate student enrollment from 300 to 600 new unlicensed student admissions each year over the next five years. The process of expanding student admissions and acquiring quality clinical sites for instruction is governed by accrediting body and clinical agency mandates and agreements. We can only place students in clinical environments that have been approved by the university legal team, the Bluegrass Planning Consortium, and other stakeholders. We anticipate the need for 75 clinical groups (8 students per group) at the time of full expansion.

An increase in student enrollments in the UK BSN program and in other schools of nursing is the impetus for scheduling clinical rotations on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Clinical sites are offering evening and weekend rotations to accommodate increased growth in student enrollments. A change in our Prep and Reading Days will allow clinical rotations to be completed on the Friday, Saturday, and Sunday before finals week while honoring a Prep/Reading Day commitment on the subsequent Monday. With two to three courses per part-of-term session, the number of final exams requiring preparation will be below the typical number of finals scheduled for full semester courses.
