	The proposed changes to the program are a resul	t of a three-prong evaluation p	rocess of the program

following its first four years. In order to determine these programmatic changes, a program assessment was completed that included field research, student feedback, and a faculty evaluation process.

AAD 750 focused on a research project, but that kind of research is typically a part of other courses (e.g. marketing research in the marketing classes). After consultation with field professionals and with the faculty, and with feedback from students, it was determined that the students (most of whom are career professionals) would be better served by additional courses in their specific areas of interest (e.g. AAD 550: Grant Writing for Nonprofit Oranizations or AAD 565: Community Engagement in the Arts) which are offered as elective courses at the 500-, 600- or 700-level. Thus, the department wants to drop AAD 750 in favor of allowing students to select additional elective courses.

Additionally, based on a three-year evaluation cycle of the program and the courses, AAD 660: Social and Cultural Entrepeneurialism has been reclassifed as an elective course instead of a required course. Evaluations, including student feedback, have determined that this course offered highly specialized content and best suited to students who select it as a program elective.

Moreover, in order to best suit the needs of the students, these changes provide 6-credit hours of electives for the students. Previously, if a student was required to complete AAD 699: Arts Administration Internship, the student had no opportunity to take elective courses at all. This change will allow students to specialize in areas including fundraising, marketing, technology, or leadership. After conducting field research, evaluating student feedback, and completing program assessment, the faculty feel that this is the best route for the program at this time.

\*The program is currently in the process of developing a variety of additional electives which range from 1-3 credit hours. Therefore, students would be able to complete the requirement by either taking two 3-credit hour course or a combination of courses that add up to 6-credit hours.
