# 14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

The following changes will bring the BA in Arts Administration in line with Standards of Curricular Best Practices: Undergraduate Programs as published by the Association of Arts Administration Educators (http://www.artsadministration.org/undergraduate-standards/).

The proposed changes to the BA in Arts Administration degree are in three areas: revised courses, new courses and dropped courses. Each area is described below in more detail.

#### **Revised Courses**

As part of our strategic planning and curricular review process, the faculty of the Arts Administration Program reviewed and revised every course in the program. During this curriculum mapping process, each course was examined for content, learning outcomes, field-based changes, and missing relevant content. As a result, every course in the curriculum has been revised -- either through minor or major revisions. Those proposals have been submitted concurrently to the program change request. Those courses are AAD 150: Exploring Arts Administration (minor change); AAD 250: Digital Design for Arts Administrators I (minor change); AAD 260: Digital Design for Arts Administrators II (major change); AAD 350: Financial Management in the Arts I (minor change); and AAD 420: Arts Administration: Practices, Polices and the Law (major change).

The three courses (AAD 150, AAD 250 and AAD 350) with minor changes are undergoing name changes and/or a change in number within the same number series. Each has also had a revision to the course description.

The two courses (AAD 260 and AAD 420) are undergoing a name change and a change in number series. AAD 260 is being dropped in number from AAD 302 as it is now part our digital design series that students should take back-to-back within their sophomore year. It also has a change in title and course description. AAD 420 is changing number series from a 300-level course to a 400-level course due to the complexity in subject matter. It has also undergone a name and course description change.

#### New Courses

During the strategic planning and curricular review process, it became clear that there were several relevant content areas in Arts Administration that could be developed in more depth for the students. These decisions were based on three sources of information: 1) a review of the Standards of Curricular Best Practices: Undergraduate Program as published by the Association of Arts Administration Educators (http://www.artsadministration.org/undergraduate-standards/); 2) an assessment of alumni survey results and graduating senior survey and focus group reports; and 3) a systematic evaluation of current curriculum through a curriculum mapping process completed by the entire Arts Administration program faculty in 2014.

As a result five new courses have been designed to be added to the BA in Arts Administration curriculum: AAD 299: Internship Orientation (1 credit hour); AAD 300: Management and Planning in the Arts (3 credit hours); AAD 370: Financial Management for the Arts II (3 credit hours); AAD 390: Programming and Event Planning (3 credit hours); and AAD 410: Arts Entrepreneurship (3 credit hours). AAD 300, 390 and 410 have each been piloted over the last several years under the program's AAD 402 Special Topics course. These courses have proved valuable for the students who took them and are critical content areas in the field of arts administration in the 21st century.

The two additional courses: AAD 299 and AAD 370 have been created based on an evaluation of need by the faculty and student feedback. AAD 299 is a one credit hour course intended to help students prepare for their required internship hours in order to make them the most meaningful. The faculty has found that many students arrive in college without the necessary skills to navigate a workplace. This course will help them focus on expectations and requirements of experiential learning and well as provide the students tools and guidance for finding appropriate arts administration internships successfully.

AAD 370 is designed as the second part of the Financial Management sequence. After teaching this course for many years, it is clear that there is too much relevant and critical information to be explored in just one semester. As such, the course has divided into two semesters. This will allow the faculty members to go into greater depth on key subjects such as budgeting and allows for topics that previously couldn't be covered due

to course length such as economic impact studies, time value of money, and investment portfolios.

### **Dropped Courses**

The proposed changes include the removal of five courses: ECO 201: Principles of Economics I, ECO 202: Principles of Economics II, ACC 201: Financial Accounting, AAC 202: Managerial Use of Accounting, and AAD 399: Arts Administration Practicum. When the program was first created 27 years ago, it had only one full-time faculty member. Thus, in order to provide students a appropriately broad education, courses from outside the field were implemented. As of 2014, the program has 3.5 full-time faculty and 12 adjunct faculty. It now has the capabilities of providing the appropriate breadth and depth of education within the field from its program resources. Moreover, the proposed curriculum is more closely aligned with the Standards of Curricular Best Practices: Undergraduate Programs as published by the Association of Arts Administration Educators (http://www.artsadministration.org/undergraduate-standards/).
