The proposed changes to the content area requirements for the Middle School Teacher Education Program (MSTEP) serve three significant purposes. First, courses no longer offered have been eliminated from the content area requirements across the disciplines. Second, with increased diversity within the public schools in which our students will complete field and practicum placements, the proposed requirements promote a greater appreciation of diversity and inclusiveness. Finally, the proposed content requirements are in better conversation with the program of studies, academic expectations as well as the Kentucky Core Content Standards for all disciplines. This alignment will ensure that the graduates of the MSTEP have exposure to the entire curriculum for which they will be responsible.
