The French faculty elected to revise the French major to bring its curriculum into line with changes occurring nationally in foreign language and culture pedagogy. Instead of dividing language and culture study into grammar study on the one hand and "everything else" on the other, language/grammar skills are evenly distributed across all courses in the major on literature, cinema, and linguistics in a way that emphasizes a coherent approach to the study of French and Francophone cultures.

NOTE: The International Studies major includes an option (FLIE) that includes French course work. Thus, a separate program change form is being submitted at the same time in order to make the changes simultaneously.
