14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

Removing ACC 201 and ECO 201 from the required pre-arts administration classes and replacing them with completion of Quantitative Foundations and Statistical Inferential Reasoning in UK core; Over the years, Arts Administration students have had increasing difficulty getting in to ACC 201 and ECO 201 classes in

their freshman and sophomore years. Particularly in accounting, students cannot even take ACC 201 until gaining sophomore status, and even then most class sections are reserved for Business majors. Because of this, Arts Administration students oftentimes are not even sure whether they can pass their pre-major requirements with the necessary GPA and move to full-major status until well into their junior, or even their senior, year. This change would require students to still demonstrate that they can handle quantitative and statistical requirements inherent in business-related degrees in classes that they can access much more quickly. ACC 201 and ECO 201 would remain graduation requirements; they would simply be moved from pre-major to core requirements.

Eliminating both credits of AAD 101 Arts Administration Professions: The main thrust of this course has been to introduce students to the work that Arts Administrators do by having working professionals visit the course and talk about their careers, and to prepare students to find internships while in school and employment once they graduate. Currently, students must take this course twice, and since it has been offered only in the spring semester, generally students end up taking the course once at the start of their Arts Administration major, and once toward the end. This has meant that the class has a mix of students from those with virtually no arts administration experience to those who are in their final semester – students with vastly different needs. Consequently, the faculty believes that the students would be better served if AAD 101 were eliminated and the materials were covered in two separate courses, one directed at new students and the second at those students about to graduate:

Increase AAD 150 Introduction to Arts Administration from one credit to three: This course would continue to introduce new students to the program and to arts administration related campus and community resources. It would also expand to include visits from practicing arts administrators, the examination of case studies that illustrate some interesting challenges that arts administrators typically face, as well as helping students search for and obtain arts administration work while attending UK, and the practicums and internships they will need to graduate.

Add AAD 450 Senior Seminar, three credits: This course would be designed for students in their senior year who are about to graduate and seek either arts administration employment or graduate studies. It would review major projects from their past Arts Administration courses, helping the students to polish these assignments and assemble them into an electronic portfolio of work samples. It would also help students develop the cover letters, resumes and references necessary to undertake job or graduate program searches. Additionally, methods used to find suitable jobs and gain admission to graduate programs would be explored as would interview and salary and benefit negotiation techniques.

Maintaining the number of credit hours to graduate at 121: Increasing AAD 150 from one to three credits, and adding the new three credit Senior Seminar course would require adding 5 new credit hours to the curriculum. To keep the number of required credit hours to graduate at a reasonable number of 121, the two credits of AAD 101 in the current curriculum would be eliminated, and the number of required Directed Electives would drop from nine to six. Students would still have 12 elective hours in the curriculum, given the six credits of arts administration Directed Electives, and the six credits of Free Electives, required by the College of Fine Arts.

Adding ACC 201 and ECO 201 as a requirement for AAD 350. A proposal to do this was actually put in and approved in academic year 2012/13. However, this change, as others, still is not showing up in the 2013/14 bulletin, nor in the course description.

Adding a Directed Electives requirement that at least 3-credits must be in AAD courses at the 500-level, Fall semester of 2013, the Arts Administration Program will welcome its first class of graduate students. This degree will be offered entirely online and will include two 500 level courses, AAD 520 The Arts and Artists in Society and AAD 540 Seminar in Arts Administration, which will be suitable for upper level undergraduate students. This requirement will not only enrich the curriculum by allowing arts administration students to take another discipline-specific course, it will also respond to a request made by this past year's graduating seniors that the range of arts administration courses be expanded.
