**14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.**

The proposal eliminates the old University Studies classes in the curriculum and replaces them with the new General Education classes. This action is necessary, because the new General Education requirements will be going into effect in the fall of 2011.

The new curriculum will stop requiring students to choose a discipline emphasis track and taking 32 – 35 credits in one of five areas: art history, art studio, music history, music performance or theatre. Instead, the students will take 30 credits within the College of Fine Arts, outside of their Arts Administration courses. Within these thirty credits, students must complete a minor in one of the arts disciplines of Art, Music or Theatre. Additionally, no more than 24 credits may be in one arts discipline.

There are many reasons for this proposed change, starting with the fact that the old Arts Administration discipline requirements were very prescriptive about what students had to take. On the other hand, the ways that Art, Music and Theatre lay out their Minor Requirements are more flexible, offering students a wider selection of courses. At the same time, Art, Music and Theatre are constantly reviewing their curriculum to make sure that their minor requirements are comprehensive and that their core classes are being offered in sufficient quantities to meet student demand.

Under the old curriculum, every time Art, Music and Theatre went through the process of changing their curriculums, the Arts Administration Program had to do the same, which led to a great deal of administrative paper and committee work, and periods of time when the Arts Administration curriculum was out of sync with those of its sister units in the College. This new approach should eliminate most of these problems, since the Arts Administration curriculum will automatically update whenever Art or Music or Theatre adjusts their Minor requirements.

This new approach also has no impact on course availability in Art, Music and Theatre, since the Arts Administration majors were already taking the same courses. In fact, this change slightly lowers the number of Art, Music and Theatre courses the Arts Administration students are required to take in the arts disciplines.

The proposal calls for a new one-credit course, AAD 150 Introduction to Arts Administration, to be added as a required course within the curriculum. In the past, the program has advised entering freshmen to wait until their sophomore year to start taking Arts Administration classes. At that point they would then take AAD 200 Arts Administration Communications. The problem with this approach is that it doesn't offer an immediate

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opportunity for incoming freshmen to develop a network of friends within their Arts Administration major, and according to current research, these sorts of networks are an important factor in determining whether new students adjust successfully to college life.

Therefore, this class will provide these new students with weekly opportunities to form friendships by attending arts events together, as well as presenting them with some foundational information on their chosen field of study. These students will then be advised to take AAD 200 Arts Administration Communications in the spring semester of their freshman year, as opposed to the fall of their sophomore year, as in the old curriculum. These changes will, therefore, both immerse students into the program quicker, and provide them with a support network of friends throughout their first year at UK.

The name of AAD 202 Arts Administration Technologies I is being changed to AAD 202 Graphic Design for Print and the Web, and the name of AAD 302 Arts Administration Technologies II is being changed to AAD 302 Web Site Design and Maintenance. The new names are more descriptive of what is being taught in these courses. Additionally, these new names are meant to appeal to a broader range of students, since the program is submitting a proposal to offer sections of AAD 202 Graphic Design for Print and the Web that will meet the new General Education requirements in Arts and Creativity. Should this class offering prove successful, both logistically and in terms of student response, the program will then propose that sections of AAD 302 Web Site Design and Maintenance also be taught as a General Education Arts and Creativity course.

AAD 302 Web Site Design and Maintenance, which has been offered a number of years as an elective, will become a required course in the curriculum. In order to be competitive in today's job market, graduates of the program need to have the best technical skills possible. With ever more activities being driven to the web, the skills taught in this class are increasingly required to land and hold a job in the field.

Additionally, the College requirement of "six credits of Art, Music or Theatre outside of the student's minor" will also be met when students complete their Arts Discipline Core requirements, since they will only be able to take a total of 24 credits in their Minor's discipline and will have to take the other 6 credits in another discipline in the College. This will then lower the total credit hours to 121.

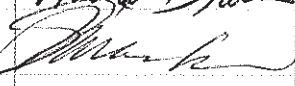
