14. Rationale for Change(s) – If rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

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Change 1. Within the Classics Track of the MCL Major the following changes need to be made. Under Track Electives ENG 274, HIS 511, HIS 512 and HIS 519 were simply left off the original proposal. These courses were included in previous iterations of the stand alone Classics majors and thus do not require letters of support.

Change 2. The Japan Studies track in the new MCL major as approved requires JPN 401 and JPN 402 as part of the track requirements. This needs to be changed to JPN 301 and JPN 302 to align it with other track in the major. Students must take JPN 301 and JPN 302 in order to enroll in JPN 401 and JPN 402. Thus JPN 301 and JPN 302 are currently hidden requirements in the major track that will delay time to graduation by a year, as these courses are sequenced. This was an oversight in the original proposal. JPN 410, a new advanced Japanese language course, has been added under Track Electives to allow those students who want to take more Japanese language courses to do so (JPN 401 and JPN 402 will be dropped). This course can be repeated up to 4 times under different topics. HIS 357 was also added as an optional course for the Japan Studies Track Requirements, currently it is only listed under Track Electives. In addition, wording needed to be changed to clarify that courses not used to fulfill track requirements can still be taken to fulfill track electives. All of these changes will make it easier for students to graduate in a timely fashion.

Change 3. RUS 404 should be changed to RUS 402. This minor change has been submitted through eCats. RUS 402: Advanced Russian II simply follows more logically from RUS 401: Advanced RUS I. The old numbering was causing confusion with students.
