Dear Dean Shay:

The Department of Art has recently approved a new course, **B.F.A. Practicum**, **Art 291** (application attached). The creation of this new course is motivated by the recent report from the National Association of Schools of Art and Design from whom we are seeking accreditation. This report called attention to the need for increased vigilance in safety training and housekeeping in the Reynolds Building studio complex.

We have designed this one-credit course to address these concerns. As the name implies, the Practicum will be directed toward advanced students in our B.F.A. program. Each student taking the course will undertake a general overview of best practices for studio safety; this portion of the course will be designed with input from UK's Fire Marshall and Environmental Health and Safety Office. Students will also receive instruction and training more specifically related to a specific studio area and then will be assigned duties related to maintaining a safe and healthy studio environment.

It must be stressed that the faculty of the Department see this course as a vital part of the academic program for B.F.A. students. The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art Studio is a pre-professional degree. It is expected that its graduates seek to establish themselves as artists, teachers, or in other professional careers in which they will have responsibility to create and maintain safe studio environments. This course is designed to provide a knowledge of safety and health concerns and practical training

in the technical aspects of the organization and maintenance of art studios. Students each semester will have to attend general orientations dealing with health and safety; training more specific to individual studio areas will follow this general orientation. Each area/studio will also have to create a syllabus for students in those areas (samples are included).

The creation of this new course will require a change in the B.F.A. degree program.
