Dear Dean Tick:

The faculty of the Department of Art, following established departmental procedures, send forward the program changes described below for the B.A. in Art Studio and the B.F.A. in Art Studio.

The changes in the program are prompted partly by the new requirements for general education adopted by the University Senate. The proposed changes also reflect the impact of budgetary cutbacks which have diminished our capacity to offer a course, A-S 331, formerly required for both programs.

For the B.A., these program changes include:

- Limitation of general education credits to be taken in the Department of Art to three credits.
- Elimination of the requirement that all students take the course A-S 331. This requirement is eliminated due to the lack of qualified full-time faculty to teach the course. Since this requirement was first discussed, the department has lost two full-time positions in the 2-D area.
- The modification of the "Studio Core" requirement so that students are now recommended to take courses in the core, but not required to do so, during the sophomore year. This change will permit students to take an additional course in the area of emphasis. This is necessary in order to allow students to create a better portfolio for BFA applications.
- Elimination of the twelve-credit hour concentration in one studio area. This requirement is eliminated in order to broaden the degree, making it conform more to the liberal arts model recommended by our accreditor, NASAD.
- The creation of a new requirement mandating that BA candidates must successfully complete a minor in another subject before graduation.

For the B.F.A., these program changes include:

- Limitation of general education credits to be taken in the Department of Art to three credits.
- Elimination of the requirement that all students take the course A-S 331. This requirement is eliminated due to the lack of qualified full-time faculty to teach the course. Since this requirement was first discussed, the department has lost two full-time positions in the 2-D area.
- The modification of the "Studio Core" requirement so that students are now recommended to take courses in the core, but not required to do so, during the

- sophomore year . This change will permit students to take an additional course in the area of emphasis. This is necessary in order to allow students to create a better portfolio for BFA applications.
- There has been an understood residency requirement of one year post entrance into the B.F.A. program, this is being put into writing as a part of the Major Course requirements.

Though prompted by changes in university requirements and budgetary issues, the faculty have put forward these recommendations in order to better serve students. As a result, students will be better prepared for application to the BFA, while students in the BA will complete a curriculum that is broad in conception, one that more closely corresponds to our accreditor's expectations. The newly required minor will add to that breadth and potentially provide graduates with additional skills that will enable them to succeed in their chosen career paths.
