7. Rationale for Changes: These changes are requested for several reasons:

 The program made the decision to participate in the upper tier writing requirement using three courses from the major sequence: CD 410, 482, 483.
 The proposal to establish writing-intensive sections of these courses was submitted in December 2005 and approved in Spring 2006. A copy of the application and approval message is attached to this application.

The listing of linguistics courses from which the students could select their
required linguistics course has not been updated for many years. Some of the
courses included have not been taught and others are less appropriate than they
initially were. The expanded listing of possible choices provides more viable
options for the students.

Feedback from students and from the instructors indicated that there was too
much overlap in content between CD 401 and CD 402. In response to this
feedback, program faculty made the decision to collapse the content into one
course (CD 402) and eliminate the other.

Eliminating CD 401 made room for the program to return CD 591 as an
undergraduate requirement, which is where is had been for years. It was moved
to a strictly graduate course in the last course revision. There is no clear
consensus across Communication Disorders programs regarding when this course
should be offered. In some programs it is an undergraduate course; in others it is
a graduate course. Our program wishes to return it to a 500 level course so it can
be taken at the undergraduate level by our students and be available at the
graduate level for our master's students from other programs who did not take
the course at the undergraduate level.

Topic: Curriculum Revisions: Bachelor of Health Sciences (Communication Disorders)

The Division of Communication Disorders is submitting changes to the undergraduate program leading to the Bachelor of Health Sciences with a major in Communication Disorders. These changes are requested for several reasons:

• The program made the decision to participate in the upper tier writing requirement using three courses from the major sequence: CD 410, 482, 483. The proposal to establish writing-intensive sections of these courses was submitted in December 2005 and approved in Spring 2006. The program wishes to make this permanent.

 The listing of linguistics courses from which the students could select their required linguistics course has not been updated for many years. Some of the courses included have not been taught and others are less appropriate than they initially were. The expanded listing of possible choices provides more viable options for the students.

• Feedback from students and from the instructors indicated that there was too much overlap in content between CD 401 and CD 402. In response to this feedback, program faculty made the decision to collapse the content into one course (CD 402) and eliminate the other (CD 401).

 Eliminating CD 401 made room for the program to return CD 591 as an undergraduate requirement, which is where is had been for years. It was moved to a strictly graduate course in the last course revision. There is no clear consensus across Communication Disorders programs regarding when this course should be offered. In some programs it is an undergraduate course; in others it is a graduate course. Our program wishes to return it to a 500 level course so it can be taken at the undergraduate level by our students and be available at the graduate level for our master's students from other programs who did not take the course at the undergraduate level.

Resources Available for Delivery of the Proposed Curriculum

There is no overall change in the number of credits the program plans to offer. Faculty are available with expertise for each course offered.
