So, to summarize:

1. NFS 314 is correct as being removed from the requirements;
2. NFS 514 replaced NFS 314. NFS 514 is not listed as a requirement (page 3 of the proposal), but it should be. (NFS 514 is shown on page 5 of the proposal and is correctly included there.)
3. NFS 512 does not exist and should not be a requirement listed on page 3 of the proposal.
4. NFS 515 is correctly listed as a requirement on page 3, but it should be correctly valued at 5 credits, not 3 as written.

Thus, NFS 514 should be added as a major requirement, valued at 3 credit hours; the credit hours associated with NFS 515 as a major requirement should be changed to the (correct) value of 5 credit hours; and the reference to NFS 512 should be removed, since that course does not exist.

Hello! In reviewing the Senate Transmittal, dated May 2, 2008, regarding the BS in Dietetics program change, I noticed an error on the proposal:

Proposed Major Requirements (page 3 of the proposal)

Shows Proposed - NFS 512 5 hours  
                          NFS 515 3 hours

In previous Transmittal (effective Spring 2008), NFS 515 was approved for 5 hours. This course was originally proposed as NFS 512; but, the number was changed at either Undergraduate or Graduate Councils.

NFS 314 (shown on the Dietetics Current list as Dropped under Proposed list) was proposed for revision and the number was changed to NFS 514 - 3 hours. The Typical Semester by Semester plan for the Proposed major, indicates NFS 514 (3hours) and 515 (5 hours) both required in the Fall of Year 4. Since the course numbering changes went through the system ahead of the program change, the course numbers must not have been corrected on the program proposal, but, were corrected on the semester by semester plan.

I have been talking with Matt Patterson in relation to the Bulletin. Could this correction be noted for the final version, please?

Re: Change in Dietetics BS program and NFS Courses

The College of Agriculture is forwarding the following curriculum proposals.

1. A change in the undergraduate degree in Dietetics. This change is primarily to reflect changes in courses within the program which are listed below.
2. Major Course Changes. *302*
  - Change NFS 204 to ~~304~~. Moving this course to the 300 level, upgrading expectations, and adding NFS 241 as a prerequisite.
  - Change NFS 818 to NFS 518. This course has always been required for the Dietetics Internship as part of the Coordinated program. Changing it to a 500 level course will also make it more accessible for graduate students. Sent to Graduate Council as well.
3. Drop Courses
  - NFS 201 – Introduction to the Dietetics Profession.
  - NFS 240 – Nutrition and Physical Fitness
  - NFS 511 – Therapeutic Nutrition. The material in this course is part of the approved course, NFS 515 (original to Graduate Council).
  - NFS 513 – Advanced Therapeutic Nutrition. Material incorporated into NFS 515 (original to Graduate Council).

These changes were all approved unanimously by the College of Agriculture UG Curriculum Committee on 10/31/2007 and by the College Faculty on 12/6/2007.
