At least 12 of these hours must be at the 300 level or above. A minor is a structured group of courses that leads to considerable knowledge and understanding of a subject. Suggested minors include Psychology, Sociology, Women's Studies, Anthropology, Economics, Political Science, Appalachian Studies, Business, Communication, Health Promotion, Human Nutrition, Community and Leadership Development, etc.

Students must contact the department responsible for the minor program for guidance and advising.

ELECTIVES: Electives at the 300 level or above to reach 120 credits including sufficient credits to reach 45 hours at the 300 level or above. Here work with an advisor to select additional FAM classes if available.

Re: Revision of the Undergraduate Program in Family and Consumer Sciences (non-teaching option)

Attached you will find the paperwork for a request for change in the Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Sciences (non-teaching option) in the Department of Family Studies including all the corrections and suggestions from our Fall 2006 meeting. The new program is in response to recent changes which eliminates a two-option model with Family and Consumer Sciences and Family and Consumer Sciences Education. That uncoupling made it possible to streamline the existing Family and Consumer Sciences option and focus on the specific knowledge and skills needed by our graduates. Streamlining the undergraduate program will free up resources to address ongoing growth in the Department's graduate programs and its research mission. This revised program meets guidelines established by the National Council on Family Relations Family Life Educator Certification.

We are proposing the following changes -

- 1. Elimination of the two-option model with Family and Consumer Sciences Education necessitates changing the name of the Family and Consumer Sciences (non-teaching option) to Family Science. The proposed Family Science title would eliminate the ongoing confusion between whether students are majoring in FCS education or FCS (non-teaching option). The proposed title reflects the home department's name (Family Studies), the faculty expertise, and the research and teaching mission of the department.
- 2. Re-alignment of course requirements in light of changes in the University Studies program
- 3. We are now requiring NFS 101 as part of the College Depth and Breadth of Study Requirement.
- 4. Under the pre-major requirements COM 252 is now required.
- 5. We have reduced the major requirements from 54 hrs. to 27 hrs. (According to College of Agriculture guidelines for curriculum development, students must have a defined major of at least 24 hours, including a 3-hr 400-level capstone course which is FAM 499).
- 6. A revised course description for FAM 499 to better reflect the emphasis on a Cooperative Extension and/or Research Internship.

- 7. Under the category of **Professional Support** each student in consultation with their advisor will select a minimum of **18-21 credits** in coursework in a university-recognized minor. At lease 12 of these hours must be at the 300 level or above (suggested minors are included in the proposal).
- 8. This program includes 17-20 hrs. of electives to reach 120 credits including sufficient credits to reach 45 hours at the 300 level or above.
- 9. The net result of these changes will show a reduction in required credit hours from 128 to 120. This should help students move through the program more efficiently.
