# 14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

AN 322 will no longer be offered and will be replaced by an upper-division accounting elective. Most states require a specific number of credit hours in accounting to sit for the CPA exam. Some states also have specific accounting course requirements. Replacing AN 322 with an upper division accounting elective will allow students the flexibility to select an accounting course that could fulfill course requirements for the CPA exam. Also, accounting has many topic areas, e.g., taxation, auditing, managerial, forensic, etc. Including an additional upper-division accounting elective will provide students the opportunity to select accounting courses in their interest area. Many of the topics that were covered in AN 322 are also covered in ACC 324, Accounting Information Systems. ACC 324 is currently a required course in the Accounting major. The Finance and Quantitative Methods Department initiated and supported the elimination of AN 322 (see the attached letter from Dr. Brad Jordan). This change does not affect the total number of credit hours in the major nor the total number of credit hours required for graduation.
