RE: Gatton College Program Changes for STA 291/296

Please find attached Program Change Forms for the Bachelor of Science in Accounting, the Bachelor of Science in Business and Economics, the Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance, the Bachelor of Business Administration in Management, and the Bachelor of Business Administration in Marketing. Also attached is a document containing the four-year plans for these programs.

The proposed changes are precipitated by the decision by A&S to no longer offer STA 291 beginning in the fall of 2015. Currently all undergraduate degree programs in the Gatton College require students to complete STA 291 as part of the pre-major requirements for the college. The proposed change is twofold.

1. First, we propose that STA 291 no longer be required as a part of the pre-major requirements for our programs.
2. Second, we propose that our students complete STA 296 in order to fulfill the UK Core Quantitative Methods Statistical Inferential Reasoning requirement. Specifically, we propose that STA 296 not be included as part of the Gatton College pre-major. All of our students will take STA 296. This course will serve to meet a UK Core requirement. STA 296 will also replace STA 291 as a prerequisite for ECO 391 and FIN 300.

The proposed changes were approved by the Gatton College Undergraduate Studies Committee on December 18, 2014; and by the Gatton College faculty on February 2, 2015.
