Re: Undergraduate Communication Degree Program MINOR Revisions

On March 7, 2012, the Department of Communication faculty voted unanimously to approve a revised curriculum for undergraduates pursuing a BS or BA in Communication. Those revisions were approved by C&I Faculty Council, UK Undergraduate Council, and University Senate. This memo summarizes the previously approved revisions and also explains the additional small change needed to the program to clarify requirements for completing the major.

Currently COM 300-324 numbered courses are available to our minors and are part of the UK Core Curriculum. However, the COM faculty voted that these courses would NOT meet upper division requirements for courses satisfying the 300 level and above course requirements for completing the COM major. However, these courses do satisfy elective requirements for the minor and major in COM. Revisions

This memo serves as clarification regarding the minor changes passed by the C&I Faculty Council and currently under review by the UK Undergraduate Council for the Communication BA/BS program changes originally submitted on 8/13/2013.

To clarify (please see the original proposal for specifics regarding all other pertinent details related to the minor changes to the Communication BA/BS program), students who were enrolled in the program at the University of Kentucky PRIOR to the enactment of the UK Core requirement will be granted an exception from the proposed changes dated 08/13/013 and WILL BE ALLOWED to count numbered courses within the COM 300-324 range towards fulfillment of their upper division COM major degree requirements. Students enrolled AFTER the enactment of the UK Core requirements will not be allowed to count these courses towards upper division major requirements (yet they will satisfy minor elective and major elective requirements) as stated in the proposed BA/BS program changes.
