Re: Undergraduate Communication Degree Program Revisions

On March 7, 2012, the Department of Communication faculty voted unanimously to approve a revised curriculum for undergraduates pursuing a BS or BA in Communication. These revisions reflect the changing nature of communication based on (a) needs assessment data derived from employer surveys, (b) the everexpanding use of social media and technology to communicate, and (c) a need to make transparent to today's students the viability and utility of a degree in Communication. This memo summarizes the revisions and rationale for them.

We currently require 36 credits in upper division communication-related coursework to earn a degree in Communication. Each of the revised tracks continue to require:

- 36 credits in combined upper division communication-related coursework
- at least 9 credits in 400-500 level upper division COM courses
- 15 credits in COGNATE courses

Thus, we are not changing the number of credit hours students will be required to take to earn their bachelor's degree in Communication.

An explanation of the revised curriculum follows. **Boldfaced** courses are new although most are currently being taught regularly as COM 591 (Special Topics) courses. The new courses have been proposed through the new online submission session. Additional human resources also will not be needed because COM 351 and COM 365 will no longer be required of every student majoring in communication.
