<u>Course Description:</u> An introductory course that surveys the Public Health subspecialty of Maternal & Child Health, reviewing basic maternal & child health issues including the medical aspects of normal pregnancy and infant care; disease processes of both, including prematurity & low birth weight; factors that influence MCH, including age, race, pregnancy spacing, and nutrition; data collection and analysis regarding reproduction; and the healthcare system which delivers MCH. Throughout the course, these issues will be explored at the local, Kentucky, national, and international levels.

<u>Course Objectives</u>: To introduce masters and doctoral students to key maternal and child health policy, access, programs, and data concepts and issues. At the completion of the course students should be able to:

- (1) Describe maternal and child health programs, policies, and services;
- (2) Describe the distribution of maternal and child health problems in the U.S. and the world:
- (3) Assess access to maternal and child health services;
- (4) Describe and interpret indices utilized in public health to assess the adequacy of maternal and child health services;
- (5) Describe care across the maternal and child health spectrum;
- (6) Describe risk factors for maternal and child health conditions/diseases; and,

(7) Describe and assess legal/ethical issues related to maternal and child health.
