Communication

Communication - Change in MA Program

Changing the admission deadline from October 1 and February 1 to February 1 only will allow that all applicants be considered at one time. There are generally few applicants for October 1 and new students are not admitted for the spring semester.

Communication - Change in Doctoral Program

- Change admission deadline from October 1 and February 1 to February 1 only.
- New policy re: waiver of required courses.
- New admission procedure.

All of these changes are directed toward (1) ensuring continued academic rigor of the doctoral program, including the reinstatement of the Communication Theory (CJT 651) requirement, and (2) streamlining the admissions process so all applicants are considered at one time. Because of limited resources, the college is instituting enrollment caps that will, however, remain flexible enough to respond to budgetary changes. The college is instituting a new policy regarding the waiver of required courses because many of their students have recently taken the same or equivalent courses at other institutions or in their own program.

The Graduate Program Committee recommends adoption of the following, effective fall 2004:

- 1 CJT 651 (Communication Theory) is added to the courses required for all doctoral students.
- 2. The required doctoral curriculum is:
 - a. Fall Semester, First Year: CJT 651, CJT 667, and STA 570
 - b. Spring Semester, First Year: CJT 631, CJT 645, and CJT 665
 - c. Fall Semester, Second Year: CJT 701 and an Advanced Statistics/Methods Course (from approved list)
 - d. Spring Semester, Second Year: CJT 790
- 3. There will only be one deadline for admission, February 1. The October 1 deadline will be eliminated. Students will continue to be accepted for summer and fall admission only.
- 4. Entering doctoral students can request to waive specific required courses if they submit evidence of equivalent coursework taken and complete a petition at the time of admission. The Review Committee will make the final decision regarding waivers. Students will be required to submit a course syllabus and a copy of the student's primary course project. The grade on the course must be reflected on the student's transcript.
- 5. Admission procedures for the graduate program will be revised to include:

Enrollment caps for both the masters and doctoral programs determined each fall by the Program Committee.

- b. A waiting list will be implemented as follows:
 - 1. By April 1, the first round of students accepted must declare their intention to enter the program.
 - 2. After April 15, the Admissions Committee may extend acceptances to students on the waiting list in order of priority. Those students will have two weeks to declare their intention to enter the program.
 - 3. As students accept or decline admission and financial aid, the Admissions Committee may or may not decide to extend acceptance to additional students on the waiting list.
