In 1999, what is now the Department of Modern and Classical Languages, Literature and Cultures received University Senate approval to combine the thenseparate majors in Greek, in Latin and in Classical Civilization to one major, that of "Classics." A similar action was taken for the minors in those areas.

Unfortunately, an administrative error occurred and the minor was named "Classical Civilization." The department's intent was that the term "Classical Civilization" would be eliminated from the major/minor nomenclature, and that there would be a single minor and major in "Classics." However, the name of the minor remains "Classical Civilization."

In order to preserve a paper trail, the Senate Council Chair suggested that a request be made by the department to enact this change, which could be placed on a transmittal without Undergraduate Council review.

Thus, the Department of Modern and Classical Languages, Literature and Cultures requests that the minor in "Classical Civilization" be changed to "Classics," as per their original intent.
