Yes. The proposed change is to replace ENG 205 with WRD 425 as a Core Requirement. Prof. Roxanne Mountford, Director of the Division of WRD provided her approval by email (attached before SRL). Explanation for change: WRD 425: Environmental Writing, taught by Erik Reece (ENS Advisory Board Member), was not available when the ENS Program was submitted for approval. The Program requires that students take Reece's section of ENG 205. This could be confusing and some students will mistakenly take other sections of ENG 205. Thus, the Program may have to allow any section of ENG 205 to count as the core requirement with the result that ENS graduates will not receive the training in environmental writing the program intended. The better alternative is to make WRD 425 a course specificallyfocused on environmental writing as a required core course.

WRD 425: Environmental Writing, taught by Erik Reece (ENS Advisory Board Member), was not available when the ENS Program was submitted for approval. The Program requires that students take Reece's section of ENG 205. This could be confusing and some students will mistakenly take other sections of ENG 205. Thus, the Program may have to allow any section of ENG 205 to count as the core requirement with the result that ENS graduates will not receive the training in environmental writing the program intended. The better alternative is to make WRD 425, a course specifically focused on environmental writing, a required core course.
