In the proposed Distance Learning format each enrolled student will be expected to log into and contribute comments to the Discussion Threads posted each week for the course on Blackboard. This explicit procedure differs from the traditional course offering mode of in-class discussion and participation. 2. Reliance on Historical Documents to be read and analyzed: This Distance Learning course will avoid questions and problems of copyrights on use of historical documents because it will make use as a required text a new book written and edited by the instructor: John R. Thelin, ESSENTIAL DOCUMENTS IN THE HISTORY OF AMERICAN HIGHER EDUCATION (published by The Johns Hopkins University Press, 2014). Copyrights for all fifty documents have been obtained and filed. This eliminates any potential conflict or violation of copyrights or reproduction permissions.

1.How does this course provide for timely and appropriate interaction between students and faculty and among students? This course provides for timely and appropriate interaction between students and faculty and among students by making use of the features offered by the University of Kentucky's Blackboard. Aspects to explore: textbooks, course goals, assessment of student learning outcomes, etc. I ensure that the experience for a DL student is comparable to that of a classroom-based student's experience by requiring the same books and texts for readings; by assigning papers and analytic assignments the same as in the traditional offering of EPE 653. I think the DL discussion threads often match and/or surpass the focus of students on providing informed comments and responses to questions about readings.
