4. Proposed change in Bulletin description:
 - (a) Present description (including prerequisite(s)):
This course will review Kentucky's vernacular architectural heritage within the perspective of historical development and ecological setting. It will include discussion of historic migration patterns and the diffusion of ideas from east coast cultural hearths. Emphasis will be placed upon understanding how the built and physical environments became the context for cultural landscape development. Rural, small town, and urban landscapes will be examined.
 - (b) New description:
This course is a topical seminar with a subtitle each time it is offered. It emphasizes an understanding of how the built and physical landscapes combine to generate locally characteristic cultural landscapes. Class readings and discussions will provide background, contextual and comparative information for class investigation of a research, design or policy problem concerning Kentucky architecture and cultural landscapes. Students will each research an aspect of the topic problem, and present their findings both orally and in written form. Prereq: Consent of instructor.
 - (c) Prerequisite(s) for course as changed: Consent of instructor.

5. What has prompted this proposal?
Periodic review of the department course offerings identified necessary corrections and clarifications to course descriptions. This course will no longer be a required course in the revised department curriculum. The changes reflect the shift to an elective seminar. The course content will not be significantly altered.

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

