Health Advocates, also refered to as Patient Navigators are very much in demand, and programs to educate students to be Heath Advocates are starting to grow across the country in various forms, e.g. certificates, undergraduate and graduate programs. The proposed minor in Health Advocacy educates students to serve as patient advocates to improve health and health care and help patients access an increasingly complex medical system. Advocacy careers span the spectrum from patient advocacy in direct service to individuals, to community advocacy initiatives on behalf of geographic or disease-specific populations, to system-level policy-based advocacy activities. The proposed minor in Health Advocacy lays a foundation for pursuing a career in this field or furthering graduate educational opportunities. Establishing a minor in this area will put UK in the forefront of this expanding and needed discipline.
