DHN 304 has been offered in the department for several decades, starting when Food Science was part of the program offerings. Food Science is now a separate program and department in the college and the Department of Dietetics and Human Nutrition plans on no longer teaching DHN 304. Our department has developed a new course that is being taught for the first time during the Fall 2019 semester. This Introduction to Culinary Medicine course will be a new requirement for students pursuing the BS in Human Nutrition and will be a good fit given the majority of students in the program are pursuing medicine, dentistry, physician assistant studies, physical therapy, and pharmacy. There are no other changes proposed - total credit hours still 120 for the degree.

1. Approval of agenda

Motion to approve by Joe Dvorak; seconded by Roger Brown. All approved.

Motion to approve by Stacy Vincent; seconded by Roger Brown. All approved.

3. New Business

a. DHN 301 Dietetics Practice (Tammy Stephenson)

Proposing to change from 2 credit hours to 1 credit hour. This will help change Didactic program from 124 to 120 credit hours.

Student learning outcomes will remain the same, the number of assignments will decrease, as well as the hours spent in class.

Mandatory membership in Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. Membership has an associated fee. Tammy is checking to see if notification of fee is required in bulletin. McNear suggested that someone write an essay about the importance of the membership for the Proof of Membership in AND assignment.

This course is taken prior to internship, so hours would not be embedded in 1200 required internship hours.

Motion to approve by Stacy; seconded by McNear. All approved.

b. DHN BS Human Nutrition major program changes (Tammy Stephenson)

Tammy: Drop DHN 304. Add DHN 599 as major requirement. Most are going to med school, etc. so it makes sense to Drop DHN 304 and add DHN 599. Nothing else

changes with regards to the BS degree program. Note that DHN 599 is not a special topics course. DHN 599 will be offered spring.

Motion to approve by Swanson; seconded by Debra Aaron. All approved.

c. DHN BS Dietetics major program changes (Tammy Stephenson)

Change because Dietitians will need to have a masters before sitting for the RD exam. BS in Dietetics, MS in Food Systems, and internship hours. Wanting to drop credit hours for Didactic program (was 124 credits, they want to drop to 120). DHN 301 course change is associated.

Believed to be the only program of its kind in Kentucky. Students will save money compared to traditional 4 year BS, 2 year MS.

Apply fall year 3. Year 4, start University Scholars program (start grad classes in year 4). Several electives at the grad level. Meeting grad school requirements for 600 level or above. Earn BS in May of year 4.

3.2 GPA scholarship requirement for University Scholars; major GPA 3.5. If they end up not meeting the GPA requirements, they would have to continue on the traditional BS path. Getting into the University Scholars program is conditional upon ending GPA. There are two applications. One to the program and one to the University Scholars. This isn't a major concern for the department – average student has a 3.65.

Internships: January through August. Timing because of preceptors' schedules.

Internship classes are currently at the 500 level. They are looking to see if they need to bump up to 600 or 700 level to meet Grad School requirements (the GCC would vote on this)

If you came here as a grad student, you would not be able to enter this program. You would have to do the traditional 2-year MS. If you already have a MS, you could enroll into the internship program.

Even with summer classes, the student will still save money. Vincent – but it might not make sense to a student to pay out of pocket for summer classes if you don't keep funding. here are 3 credit hours that have to be taken during the summer. Tammy – would move classes around to keep the students' best interest in mind. Fulltime student is 9 credit hours. hese students are not eligible for assistantships.

Jamie – financial aid is awarded on a yearly basis. Only fund summer if they have leftover funds.

MS is 36 hours. Internship hours are kept separate. Students have to pay for internship credit hours. Nationwide standard, department hasn't been able to adjust this.

Considering changing BS progression requirements. Proposing to remove needing a C or better to move onto major courses. But they only require a 2.4 GPA to move on. They don't believe a D on their transcript will keep them from getting an internship, nor impact their future coursework.

Motion to approve by Dvorak; seconded by Swanson. All approved.
