The Advisory Committee of the International Studies major, in conjunction with the foreign language departments, has discussed allowing the Foreign Language and International Economics (FLIE) track/option to revert to being a stand-alone major. The goals of the FLIE major would fit better and are more closely aligned with the language areas, as well as with programs in the College of Business and Economics. FLIE majors are much more business oriented due to the coursework and pragmatic thinkers, given the student make-up of the majors. It is a good major in that it also introduces cultural sensitivity, which is essential when working in the international marketplace. The IS capstone course is not well suited for FLIE majors. It was the determination of the IS Advisory Committee that FLIE should be placed in the Department of Modern & Classical Languages, Literatures & Cultures, the Department of Hispanic Studies, and/or the Department of Economics. The International Studies Advisory Committee agreed to this change on January 19, 2012. The Department of Economics agreed to the change on January 23, 2012.

Thanks very much for your update. Please include this note in the file to go forward:

The FLIE steering committee has made ample provision to attend to the needs of current FLIE majors. Primarily, this is an administrative change and not a curricular change, so students may not even notice the change. First, no course is being discontinued, so all the required courses for the current major will still be available. Second, current students will retain their current A&S advisor. Third, the directors of undergraduate studies of each language area will continue to reach out to current majors, as they will also do for new majors - and all majors will be informed promptly of these changes once they have been fully approved. There will be a difference on the transcript and diploma: current majors will receive a diploma in International Studies; the transcript will include the Option: Foreign Language and International Economics. Future majors will receive a diploma in Foreign Language and International Economics.
