The French faculty elected to revise the French major to bring its curriculum into line with changes occurring nationally in foreign language and culture pedagogy. Instead of dividing language and culture study into grammar study on the one hand and "everything else" on the other, language/grammar skills are evenly distributed across all courses in the major on literature, cinema, and linguistics in a way that emphasizes a coherent approach to the study of French and Francophone cultures.

The International Studies Major is for the most part comprised of courses offered by other programs/departments. In order to best serve our students, we believe it prudent to have similar requirements to those of the "home" department. We have also simplified the upper division requirements of FLIE-French so that we do not need to submit a new program change each time new courses are added to the French curriculum. We used the more streamlined requirements that we already have in pllace for FLIE-Spanish as our model and which has been working well. The premajor has changed slightly: FLIE-French IS students will now be required to take FR 204 and FR 307 as before, but will now have a choice of either FR 214 or FR 215 (new French Studies courses which will be in place in Fall 2011) for a total of 9 hours.
