Adding a required introductory course to the International Studies Major (New Course

Proposal; UK Core Proposal; Program Change Proposal)

At the International Studies Advisory Committee meeting held last week (February 2<sup>nd</sup>), we concluded our discussions regarding the new course we wish to add to the International Studies BA. The Advisory Committee (members present: Dr. Francis Musoni, History; Dr. Hang Nguyen, History; Dr. Carlos De La Torre, Sociology; Dr. Diane King, Anthropology; Dr. Mark Whitaker, Anthropology; Dr. Joe O'Neil, MCLLC; Ms. Jenn Garlin, A&S Advising) approved the creation of the new course (INT 200) and the draft syllabus as included in the New Course proposal submitted via ecats. The Committee also approved the associated Program Change to make the course a required course for all International Studies majors. This Program Change Proposal is submitted to the A&S Dean's Office for routing through the College's EPC.

By way of background and rationale, permit me to offer the following remarks. As you know, this major currently has only one required International Studies course – the capstone senior seminar (INT 495). In order to address the need for International Studies majors to get a firm foundation in this interdisciplinary field at the start of their university studies, we propose that all students who come to UK



with a declared International Studies major be required to take this new course (INT200 Introduction to International Studies) and to take it in their first semester. Students who declare the major while already at UK are expected to take INT 200 as soon as possible after declaring the major. In addition to providing a solid intellectual basis for their further studies, this course is also designed to be exciting and to offer students a chance to dive into their chosen field as soon as they start at UK (or declare the major). Furthermore, the course will give students interested in International Studies structured opportunities to meet others with similar interests and to meet the faculty with whom they will be learning later on in their major. We are certain this will help with student success and retention for this significant group of students. There are, as you know, about 280 International Studies majors and they lack the natural home that an academic department with its own faculty provides. Establishing this new course also responds to the recommendations of two external reviews (the latest one was in 2014) urging that this be a priority.

In order to include the new course in the BA without adding any additional credit hours, we propose that it be required but that it: (1) count for the Global Dynamics UK Core requirement (which the students have to take anyway). So, students currently just pick a course that satisfies the Global Dynamics requirement, but in the future they will take INT200 which will satisfy this requirement (assuming it is approved by the UK Core committee). (2) will count as a "Pathway" course in the major. Currently the students choose two introductory or "Pathway" courses from an approved list. Under the proposed change, they will take INT 200 and one other from the approved list. How the proposed changes impact the 4 Year Plan may be seen by comparing the current and proposed versions that are included with this proposal.

So, in fact, though we are adding a requirement to the major, there are no additional credit hours required, and there is even more flexibility, so the average time-to-degree may even be shortened for International Studies students.

Thank you for your advice and support as we go about strengthening this popular undergraduate major.

If no objection is raised to the Senate Council Office within ten days of the posting the proposal, then the program change is approved. The Senate Council Office will report approvals to the Provost, Registrar and other appropriate entities, including the contact person.

For every proposed change, you MUST also include the existing requirement.


