The decision to realign our classes and put greater emphasis on multimedia storytelling is so that we keep up with accreditation requirements to teach students more multimedia skills so they may be platform agnostic when they present information. Our curricula will be expected to be "responsive to professional expectations of digital, technological and multimedia competencies," according to ACEJMC. The move to include a minor (with the possiblity of two minors or a double major) will allow our students the broad background required by ACEJMC. It also allows students to explore more subjects. Journalists need as broad a

background as possible.

Nine hours of MA, STA or CS courses beyond University Core requirements are required for the BS degree plus 60 hours of science from mathematics, statistics, computer science, biological sciences, social and behavioral sciences and appropriate professional fields.

This provides for a total of 42 elective hours (44 if the language requirement must be satisfied). It includes the nine hours of MA, STA or CS required beyond the University Core; 12 additional hours from the College may be included as appropriate professional hours, so students will reach the 60 hours of science required for the BS when applicable classes from the UK Core are included. The map is designed so that students complete I through VII of the Core by Fall Year Two as well as all three premajor classes so they may enter upper division by Spring Year Two, allowing ample time to complete all major and minor requirements.
