**COURSE DESCRIPTION**: A complex exploration of the forms, technique and rhythms that comprise American Jazz Dance

#### TEXT:

Kraines, M. G., and Pryor, E. (1990). ( $3^{rd}$  Ed.) <u>Jump Into Jazz</u>, Palo Alto, CA: Mayfield.

#### **LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

- 1. Develop a greater appreciation for jazz dance as an art form.
- 2. Gain a basic knowledge of the history and philosophies of jazz dance.
- 3. Become knowledgeable about jazz chorographic forms and apply that knowledge to form educated critical opinions.
- 4. Develop an understanding of the training system for the body called dance technique, and as a result, gain greater control, movement efficiency, and precision.
- 5. Experience a basic introduction to composition.

## **COURSE GOALS/OBJECTIVES:**

Upon completion of this course students will have acquired a more thorough understanding of the skills necessary to be a dance artist in the world today. This will include, but is not limited to:

- 1. A demonstration of intermediate skills and techniques of a beginning jazz dance artist.
- 2. A demonstration of intermediate skills and techniques used in choreographing more complex movements.
- 3. A strong work ethic, proper dance vocabulary, and the ability to think critically.

# **COURSE CONTENT:**

- 1. Movement Skills
- 2. Improvisation and choreography
- 3. Reading, projects, and tests from text
- 4. Attendance and written critiques of Live Dance Performances

# **METHODS OF EVALUATION:**

1. Class attendance is mandatory.

A maximum of three unexcused absences are permitted. After the third unexcused absence, your FINAL grade will be lowered by 7 pts to reflect each additional unexcused absence beyond three. (perfect attendance: add 10 pts to final grade). Three instances of tardiness of more than 5 minutes will be counted the same as one unexcused absence.\*Acceptable reasons for excused absences are listed in Students Rights and Responsibilities.

- 2. Attend 3 live performances and **TYPE** a critique of each within one week of closing night. Dates: to be announced.
- 3. There will be three skill tests covering combinations and choreography learned in class. Dates: to be announced. (evaluation based on student's ability to improve his or her skills from the beginning of the semester.)
- 4. There will be two written exams covering readings from the text.

Dates: to be announced.

- \* In Studio dance performance for all dance classes on April 30, 2003. Invite friends, family and colleagues...participation is worth 5 pts to final grade.
- \* Participation in the U.K. Dance Ensemble concert is worth 5 pts to final grade. Participation is by audition and invitation only.
- \* All tests must be taken at the appointed time. Due to illness, you may reschedule if you have contacted the instructor **prior** to the appointed testing time. Students who do not make arrangements with the instructor will receive a zero on the test.

#### **MIDTERM GRADING POLICY:**

Students' progress will be assessed halfway through the semester based upon Skill Test One, Written Test One, the first external Dance Critique, and class attendance. In accordance with University policy, these Midterm grades will be accessible online via the MyUK web portal by the Midterm date.

#### WRITING SKILLS:

Regardless of discipline, teachers have the right – and the obligation – to expect that students use English properly in all aspects of the course. (S.R.5.2.4.3.) Instructors can ask students to rewrite papers, make writing style one of the grading criteria, and report a seriously deficient student to his/her college for remedial work.

# **COURSE GUIDELINES AND EXPECTATIONS:**

- **1. Additional instances include falsification of identity resulting from having another person sign the attendance sheet for you when you do not attend class. All instances of plagiarism and cheating will be reported to the Dean of Students.
- **2. Classroom Behavior**: It is important to respect the dignity and values of all in the classroom. It is expected that you will come to class focused and with a positive attitude. You are here to dance and learn about dance in an academic environment. Be open to new ideas, approaches, and constructive criticism. It is how we learn as dancers. Poor attitudes and egos will not be tolerated in this class. Your positive participation and willingness to learn will be reflected in your skills exam grade.
- **3.** Cell Phones: The use of cell phones in class is prohibited. This includes checking your messages. If you talk on the phone or text during class you will lose 5 points.
- **4. Individual Work**: When doing individual work, document the resources you use for information or background material. Even if it is on the Web- document the source.
- **5. Group Work:** When working in groups, you must all contribute equally to earn the grade. It is not fair to the group leader to make them carry the work load of the group. Individuals who do not contribute equally will receive a lower grade.
- **6. Email**: You may email papers and reports, however, you are risking that the document may not get to the teacher. YOU MUST get a returned email from me within 24 hours letting you know the teacher has received your document. If you do not get a return email, assume the teacher did not get it and bring a hard copy to the next class or to the studio. Hard copy papers are recommended to decrease the likelihood of a paper not getting thru by email.
- **7. Disability Statement:** It is the responsibility of any student with a physical or learning disability to communicate with the instructor at, or immediately following, the first class meeting to discuss means of meeting said disability.
