14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

Previous approval restriced students to specific courses to count in the UK core area, this program change will allow for greater ease for transfer students from outside and within the University to fulfill both UKCore requirements and professional electives.

BIO 102: Human Ecology is currently included as a requirement within Program Related Studies. Students are also required to take PSY 100, SOC 101, BIO 103, ANA 209, and PGY 206, NFS 101 and KHP 240 in this core. The course description for BIO 102 is: "A study of the interrelationships of man populations space energy food mineral resources and other life on earth. Not for life science majors." BIO 102 is not a prerequisite course for other courses in Program Related Studies, the Professional Education Course Sequence, or the Major in Health Promotion and this would reduce the total number of credit hours for our Health Promotion Teacher Certification students by 3 credits. Those who major in the Health Promotion Teacher Certification will have a minor requiring an additional 18-21 hours.

We are proposing to drop KHP 361 (1 hour credit) and add KHP 577 (3 hours credit). Presently students earn 1 hour credit in KHP 361 for 45 hours of observation in public schools. The Kentucky Education Professions Standards Board has mandated that prior to student teaching, all teacher education students including those in the Health Education Teacher Education Program (HEPR) complete a total of 200 observation hours in schools prior to student teaching effective Fall Semester, 2013. Therefore in order for our HEPR teacher education students to be able to complete a total of 200 hours of observation, we are planning to require they complete a majority of the hours (146 hours) in KHP 577. The remaining observation hours will be embedded within other HEPR major courses and College of Education Pre-Professional courses as applicable.
