Current Course Description for Bulletin: This course introduces students to the laws and policies governing the formation operation and dissolution or conversion of nonprofit organizations, including charities, foundations, associations, and clubs. The general substantive coverage of the course is approximately one-half "organizational: law - the state law governing the formation and operation of the entity - and approximately one-half federal income tax law.

Proposed Course Description for Bulletin: This course introduces students to the laws and policies governing the formation operation and dissolution or conversion of nonprofit organizations, including charities, foundations, associations, and clubs. The class will cover the creation and governance of nonprofit organizations as well as federal tax law relating to charities and other nonprofit organizations. The class will include both lectures and practical exercises.
