Business Administration – Change in MBA

The Gatton College of Business and Economics faculty approves dropping MGT 697 Top Management Leadership in the Contemporary Business Environment as a required course in the MBA program (see attached form). The course was established as a required MBA course during the 1996-97 academic year. Once established, the course was taught almost exclusively by Professor Greg Dess. Roughly, 20 to 30 percent of the content of MGT 697 is now included in other management courses, e.g., MGT 611, MGT 620 and MGT 699. Since Professor Dess has left the University and because some of the content is covered in other management courses, the request is to remove MGT 697 as a requirement in the MBA program.

The faculty also approves changing the designation of I3A 610, Global Business Management to MGT 610, Global Management. The BA prefix was initially used to enable faculty from other B&E departments to teach Global Business Management. The fact is that it has been caught and will continue to be taught exclusively by management faculty. Furthermore, in compiling historical credit hour information, since the management faculty teach BA 610, it should be classified and included with the management course offerings.
