13. Please explain the rationale for changes. If the rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to those requirements.

Currently, elite universities such as the University of Chicago, the University of California at Berkeley, and the University of Michigan are the major competitors for the MPP degree.

The Martin School's MPP Committee responded to feedback from former students and the past year's external review committee of the Martin School by examinining the MPP curriculum of competing institutions. As part of the review, we learned that the curriculum for the MPP was weaker than other programs in the areas of economics and data analysis. We are addressing this by increasing the prerequisites for the program (intermediate micro economics rather than simply principles of economics, basic statistics, and calculus) as well as adding two required courses that are now electives in our curriculum. These courses are PA 624 (focus on government information systems and big data management) and PA 683 (tax policy which is the reputational focus of the Martin School). The tax policy course will replace cost-benefit analysis which becomes an elective. This change aligns with the career paths of many of our graduates who become budget analysts in a variety of public and nonprofit settings. These changes strengthen our position vis-à-vis elite universities and position the Martin School to offer a "Best Value" MPP degree.

Process: The suggestions of the committee were presented to the faculty via e-mail and discussed at a faculty meeting. Approval of the faculty was unanimous.
