Topic: Curriculum Revisions: Master of Science in Communication Disorders

The Division of Communication Disorders is submitting several changes to the graduate program leading to the Master of Science in Communication Disorders and Certification from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. These changes represent a response to changes in the practice of speech-language pathology, feedback from graduates and external supervisors indicating the need for additional coursework in pediatric dysphagia and cognitive communication disorders, and the addition of new faculty members with expertise in those areas. To make room for the additions at the graduate level, one course (CD 691), currently offered at the graduate level, is being returned to the undergraduate level. The net effect of the changes to the graduate program is to add nothing to the credits required for the master's degree itself, but to add at most 2 credits to the requirements for the ASHA certification program.

Resources Available for Delivery of the Proposed Curriculum

The proposal adds a net of 2 credits to the graduate course work that must be offered. With the addition of two new faculty lines in the past year, the program has sufficient faculty to absorb those two additional credits.

Summary

Two tables are attached to help clarify the changes made and their impact on the graduate curriculum. The first table provides a comparison between the current curriculum and the proposed curriculum. The second demonstrates the typical progression through the proposed curriculum for a student who is seeking both the MSCD degree and ASHA certification.
