We are also enclosing Appendix I, which provides the documentation for our Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music that you have requested, and a copy of our internal "Request for Change in Masters Degree Program" at UK.

In looking back over the issues from the beginning of our attempt to get our Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music program approved, it appears the lack of a public recital was the central issue. We are adapting the language required for certification found on page 95 (I) of the 05-06 NASM Handbook and are separating the recital from the internship completely.

This response hopefully makes the recital a separate and important item in the curriculum and provides documentation for the level expected of graduates holding the degree of Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music. We have also added the recital as a specific item in our listing of course requirements for the degree as shown in Appendix I.

Again, we believe this change strengthens our program and clearly aligns us with the NASM accreditation guidelines. We trust that our response and these enclosed materials will place us once again as a fully accredited School of Music. Response to NASM Commission Action Report of June 30, 2006 Re: Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music University of Kentucky School of Music

New Curriculum:

In response to the NASM Commission Action report of June 30, 2006, the Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music Committee considered the Committee report and arrived at the following solution to meet the guidelines for the Performance requirement for the Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music:

Our last degree proposal stated:

"in keeping with the requirements of the Master of Music in Performance degree, it is essential that the Internship projects result in significant performance experiences, one of which (or a combination) will be equivalent to a regular M.M. performance recital."

Our revised statement meant to satisfy the NASM guideline reads:

Students must present a public recital or a comparable public musical presentation as a demonstration of competence in performance at the same level as the Master of Music Performance Degree. The recital requirements include meeting equivalent performance level requirements and level of difficulty in literature as our M. M. in performance, securing recital approval before a performance faculty committee at least three weeks in advance of the recital, and a public performance of the recital with traditional documentation (recording, program, and major faculty approval signature) as required by the UK School of Music.

This clarification of the recital component serves to separate the M.M. Recital from the other two Internships, even though those two courses also involve performance experiences. It is our sincere hope that this clarifies and meets the full requirements for NASM approval of this new curriculum.

MASTER OF MUSIC WITH EMPHASIS IN SACRED MUSIC VOICE, KEYBOARD, CONDUCTING

The UK School of Music presents the Master of Music with emphasis in Sacred Music. This degree involves the completion of core coursework at the University of Kentucky, as well as 6-9 credits of coursework at an accredited seminary or other appropriate institution. One option available to the student involves a collaborative curriculum between the University of Kentucky and Lexington Theological Seminary, leading to the award of the Master of Music from UK and the Master of Arts with emphasis in Church Music from Lexington Theological Seminary.
