<u>Course Description</u>: This course is directed toward developing entry-level competencies needed in the field of music therapy and is geared toward individuals with non-music therapy undergraduate degrees who wish to obtain an equivalency in music therapy. Classes will consist of lecture/ discussion, lab- based activities and field experience opportunities.

Course Objectives/Outcomes: By course end, students will demonstrate (a) basic knowledge of existing MT methods, techniques, materials, equipment and their applications, (b) basic knowledge of purpose, intent and function of MT for various populations, and (c) basic knowledge of the psychological and physiological aspects of musical behavior and experience

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Permission of the instructor. This course is required for individuals seeking either the equivalency or the Combined/Equivalency Master's Degree in Music Therapy. This course does not count toward the 30 credits needed for the master's degree.
