General Info

<u>Course Description</u>: This course is designed to impart entry-level clinical competencies through site-based clinical experiences in a student-selected area of interest. Students will complete a minimum of 900 hours and a maximum of 1044 hours of clinical training in medical, psychiatric, special education, geriatric or other clinical music therapy setting. (Hours will be determined based on number of pre intern training hours completed.)

<u>Student Learning Outcomes:</u> The primary objective of the clinical internship experience is to provide opportunities for practical application of the music therapy curriculum. By course end, students will be able to demonstrate clinical, professional and documentation skills and demonstrate preparedness for the music therapy certification exam.

<u>Prerequisite</u>: Permission of instructor. Students must have successfully completed all equivalency-level educational requirements prior to internship. No exceptions will be made.
