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Dear Dr. Chard,

The College of Health Science's Faculty Council met last Friday to discuss this issue, among others. A formal request for feedback was circulated among the entire faculty on Monday of last week, giving approximately 4 days for response. While the response time was limited, only two concerns were raised. They were:

- 1) Which area committees will remain in existence, e.g., medical? Basic science? Clinical? Concern was expressed that area committee members not knowledgeable about the activities of faculty with significant percents of their DOE for clinical activities or clinical coordinators might not appreciate the amount of time required, the expected outcomes, etc. for these activities, adversely affecting P&T decisions.
- 2) All dossiers should be directed through an appropriate area committee and the Provost, including Clinical Title Faculty (rather than routing these through the office of the EVPHA).
- 3) The role of the Executive Vice President for Health Affairs was unclear and should be clarified.

If other comments or concerns arise I will direct them to you.
