After growing to over \$80 million the endowment fell to \$56.9 million in 2009.

The endowment continues to recover and is now over \$75 million.

Collection Review Process

Overall cost increase estimates range between 5% and 6% and in some areas even higher.

Science, technology, and medical resources are estimated to increase by at least 6% to 8%.

Both print and electronic resources increase each year.

In the event that cuts are necessary for FY15, the review process is already underway in consultation with colleges, departments, and centers.



Medallion for Intellectual Achievement




Dr. Karl Raitz, one of the country's foremost cultural geographers, received the 2014 Medallion awarded by UK Libraries.


