- 3. Moderate tuition and fees increase affordable rates for students and their families

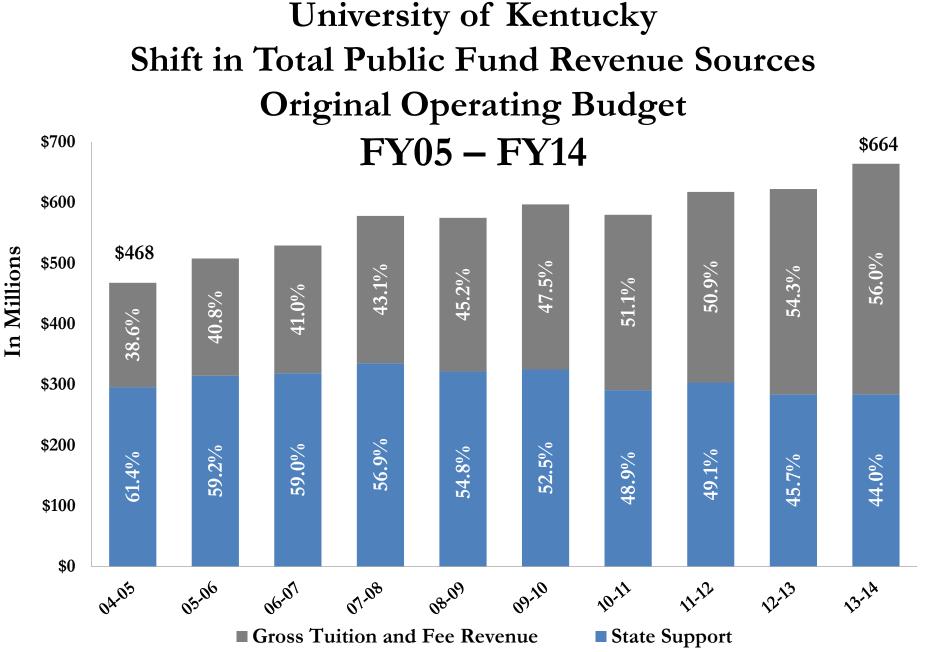




University of Kentucky Current Funds Revenue Budget

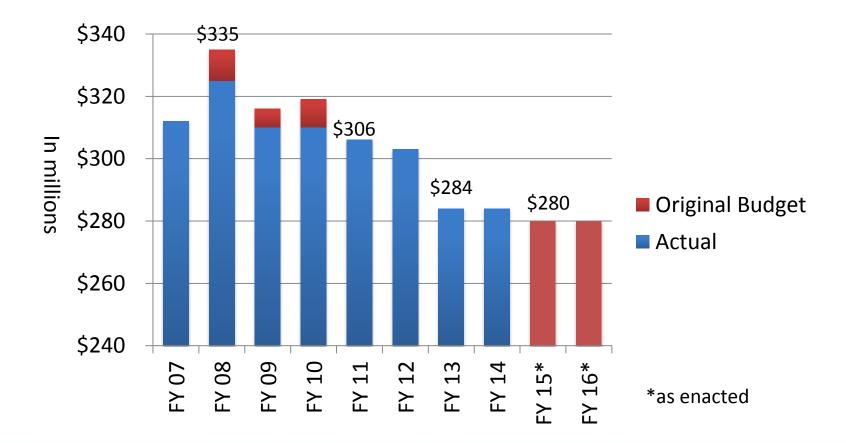

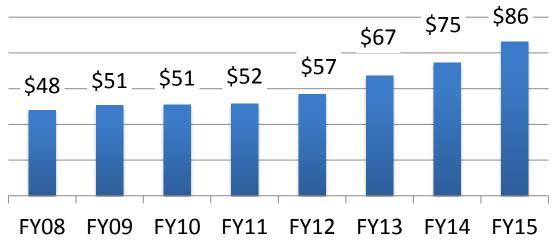

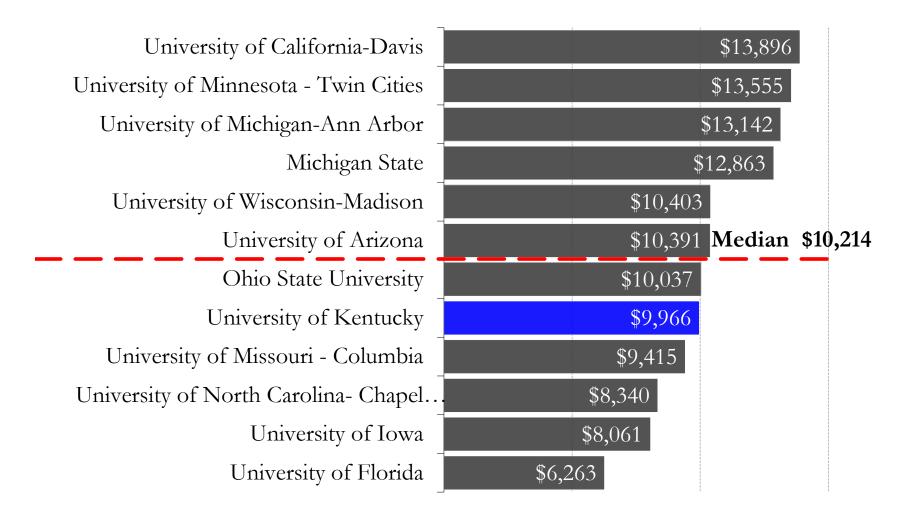
UK Funded Student Financial Aid



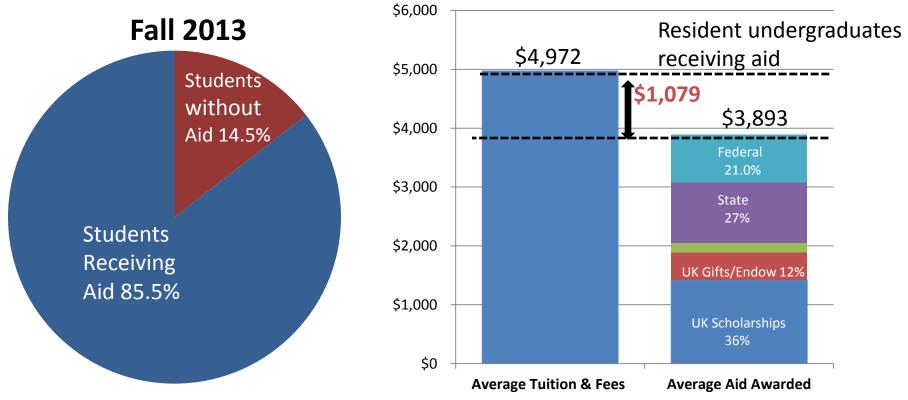

Resident Undergraduate Tuition and Fees, FY 2013-14



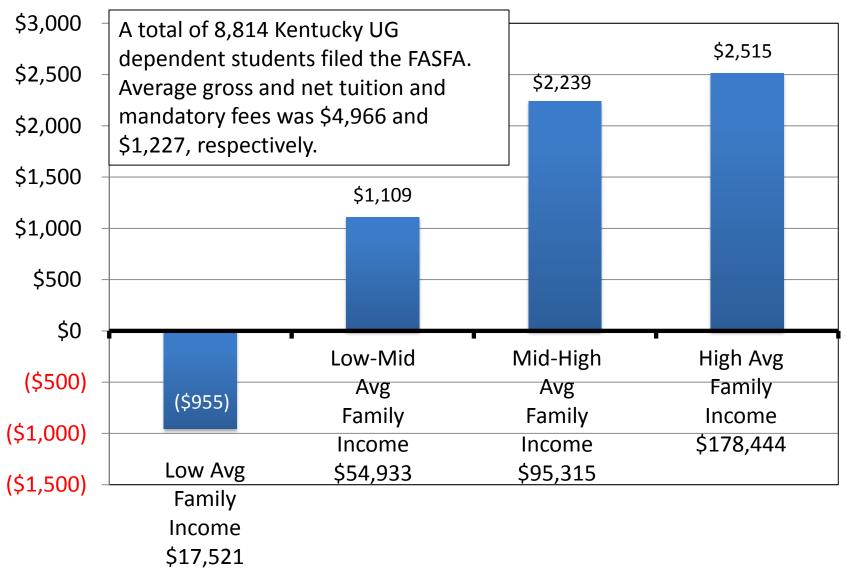
University of Kentucky Full-time, Kentucky Resident Undergraduates Receiving Grants or Scholarships



A total of 12,986 (85.5%) of 15,189 resident undergraduates received some form of financial aid in Fall 2013. These students paid an average of \$1,079 out-of-pocket for tuition and mandatory fees.

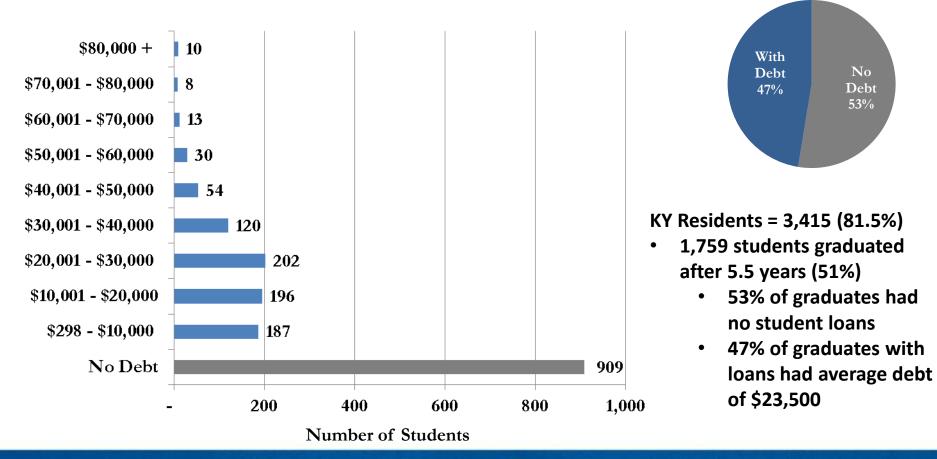

Median Earnings by Education Level

- Workers, age 25 and older, with a high school diploma earned \$33,800 before taxes.
- Workers, age 25 and older, with a bachelor's degree earned \$55,700 before taxes.
- Additional earnings, after taxes, of a worker with a bachelor's degree would pay off \$23,500 of student loans in less than two years.
