Request for Change in Ph.D. Business Administration

Currently, prospective students are required to submit scores of their GMAT. The request is to permit GRE scores as a substitute for GMAT scores.

The language proposed by the College of Business and Economics for inclusion in the Graduate Bulletin is provided below.

"Also, students without GMAT scores must take the exam and submit scores before an admission decision can be made. In some areas and at the discretion of the Director of Graduate Studies, the GRE may be accepted as an alternative to the GMAT"

There are no plans to define a minimum score for the GRE.

II. RATIONALE FOR CHANGE(S)

Currently policy dictates that when prospective students submit applications only the GMAT is acceptable. An increase in the number of outstanding applicants who have taken the GRE has prompted a re-visiting of this requirement A review of admission requirements for the same Ph.D program at other schools has shown that their policies have been modified to allow acceptance of the GRE, to remain competitive with these schools a similar modification for our Ph.D. program is both desirable and essential. The specializations in FInance & Decision Sciences are particularly affected as desirable qualifications for these areas require backgrounds that include math, economics. engineering and computer science. Prospective applicants with these backgrounds are more likely to have GRE scores.
