**14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.**

The Middle Level Teacher Education Program prepares students to teach young adolescents, grades 5-9. Each student selects two content areas which they learn to effectively teach in middle grades classrooms. There are four tracks, or content areas, (Math, Science, Social Studies and English) and we are only proposing to change the Social Studies track. The proposed content area coursework changes in Social Studies are intended to provide more depth of content area knowledge and to align more closely to National Standards. In addition, the proposed changes align more closely with the Kentucky Core Academic Standards. These changes will provide more options for students taking the courses, which will increase the likelihood that students can complete the program and graduate in four years. This change will also provide consistency across content areas. Students selecting Math, English/Language Arts or Science are required to take 24-25 credit hours of content work. Increasing Social Studies from 18 to 24 credit hours will put that

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content area in line with the others.
