

NEW MINOR

An academic minor is a secondary area of study that is separate from the major and is typically defined by a set of courses and/or credit hour requirements within a specified discipline. In other words, a minor is a structured group of courses that leads to considerable knowledge and understanding of a subject, although with less depth than a major. Minors are typically between 18 and 32 credit hours in length, depending on the college and disciplinary area.

Once approved at the college level, your college will send the proposal for a new minor to the appropriate Senate academic council (HCCC and/or UC) for review and approval. Once approved at the academic council level, the academic council will send your proposal to the Senate Council office for additional review and then a 10-day posting online, during which senators review on their own and have an option to register an objection if they so desire. If no objection is raised to the Senate Council Office within ten days of the posting the proposal, then it is approved. The Senate Council Office will report approvals to the Provost, Registrar and other appropriate entities, including the contact person.

Dear Professor Testa,

I am writing to support including our Geography courses in a proposed ROTC minor. However, I do have some concerns that I will share with you.

The proposed minor has been presented as focused on "Military Leadership," yet I see nothing in the proposal that directly addresses this topic, nor do any of our courses! I wrote to Megan Kidd regarding this question, and I paste a portion of my email here:

The Geography Department is happy, *in principle*, with any of our courses you might want to include in a proposed minor. I am somewhat perplexed by your *choice* of our courses (GEO 133, 261, 163) beyond their status as "UK Core courses." We do not offer any courses in Leadership *qua* leadership, including those you have listed. Nor would any of our courses satisfy any of the other Learning Outcomes as listed in the proposal you sent me (which seem mostly to bear on military procedure). Now, if your "Leadership" rationale were (or were more clearly stated as) to help students in the minor gain an understanding of the kinds of 21st century global (or even GeoInt) issues facing the US Military's next generation of leaders, then those three courses might fit.

I suggested other, core curriculum, no-prerequisite courses that Ms. Kidd also could include. She has indicated to me that ROTC would include those also; although her response did not address my concerns regarding the *rationale* for either the minor or for including our courses, beyond it being a way to "make the minor more diverse" and "our benchmarks are doing curriculums much like what we are suggesting."

In sum, we want to support this minor. We want our courses included. We would encourage the EPC to help Ms. Kidd to better define the minor, its rationale, and its learning outcomes to justify its structure. I am happy to discuss, help, whatever. Just ask.

My name is Megan Kidd and I am the Department Manager for Air Force ROTC. Over the past three months I have been working diligently to conduct in depth research through University of Kentucky's Benchmark institutions as well as the SEC institutions to identify other schools that currently offer some sort of military leadership minor for their ROTC students on campus. I have included this information in the PDF, and found that many in both Benchmark and SEC institutions do offer these existing minors.

The background on ROTC for both Air Force and Army, are students that are wanting to pursue a commissioning to be Second Lieutenants in the military post graduation, and will serve in positions aligned with their interests in the military and their college majors. These students take ROTC courses, ranging anywhere from 24-30 hours, in addition to their major/minor requirements outside of our program. This ROTC program serves as an opportunity for them to not just serve our country, but be leaders and have a great and potentially long career post-graduation. Some of our cadets/students are required to have a minor to graduate depending on their major, and most are not able to show their ROTC completion on their degree because we are not a listed major, and have no minor currently implemented at the university level.

What we are proposing is that we have a combined ROTC (both Air Force and Army) minor that not only benefits our current students, but could be of interest to other students across campus. We have implemented a proposal with various courses embedded throughout the colleges/departments across campus to show that we want our students to have a diverse understanding of leadership, social science, historical perspective, and produce well-rounded students for their impending professional and academic careers. I also want to note that this minor is going to be open to ALL students on campus, not just ROTC. Our ROTC courses are technically available to any student that wants to take them currently. The only difference is if a student wants to participate in our courses that are considered civilians, they are not required to wear uniforms, stand when the professor enters, or partake in any military-like customs the other cadets/students in ROTC would be involved with. I am the only university based employee in this office, so I have been able to encourage non ROTC students to take our courses before and they have all seemed to enjoy them thoroughly.
