Explanation of Proposed MCL Major Changes for Bulletin

As the MCL major has 7 tracks, each of which accepts a number of courses as electives, it is difficult to maintain an accurate list of courses that count toward the major. This minor, primarily editorial, rewrite of the major was undertaken not to change any requirements, but to simplify how courses listed as electives are listed in the bulletin. Each language track now accepts all 300+ courses from its track, and in some instances, some additional courses (which have all already been approved and listed in past years). Last year for example, new courses were approved in CHI, JPN, & RUS that will have to be added as courses that count as electives for those tracks. Instead of submitting a major change to the bulletin each year to add new courses of this type, it was deemed easier to update the wording for each major track and its electives. Only courses outside the major track or not 300+ are now listed. This will eliminate the need to submit cumbersome program changes every 1-2 years.

The courses listed from outside MCL, AIS, CHI, CLA, FR, GER, HJS, ITA, JPN, RUS are all existing electives and have not been added as new electives. Our goal is to make it easier to designate courses within tracks as electives without providing laundry lists of courses that must be consistently updated.

In addition, a list of MCL prefixed courses that count for all tracks were listed once before the individual track descriptions. These are primarily study abroad and language practicum/internship courses.

The following wording will now appear before the description of each individual track.

Other Course Work Required for the Major MCL Tracks 30

Student complete 30 hours of track requirements and track electives within one of 7 MCL language and culture tracks. Repeatable courses may be applied up to the maximum number of hours allowed for the course. Additional iterations of courses listed under track requirements may be applied under track electives. 2a	Describe the rationale for the changes, including results from the most recent program review if applicable. (450 word limit)	<p>The MCL major is only two years old (the result of merging 7 stand alone language majors). During this time we realized that we needed to list the track electives for the 7 tracks in the major in a manner that is easier to maintain (so we don't need to submit a program change each time we create a new course or delete a course that counts as a track elective). We have rewritten the list of "track electives" to include all 300+ courses within the track, i.e. all 300+ GER courses for German Studies track. We also included a list of MCL courses that count as track electives for all 7 tracks. With these editorial change, only the specific courses listed as track electives for each track which are not MCLLC department courses need to be listed. None of the courses listed from outside MCLLC in this proposal are new or being added to the tracks, they were all previously listed as track electives and approved. The only "new or additional courses" this rewriting brings into the major track electives are MCL courses previously left off and courses from the language tracks themselves (AIS, CHI, CLA, FR, GER, JPN, RUS) that were not specifically listed (in some cases because they were accidentally left off and in some cases because we've approved new courses that should now count as track electives for a particular track). There are no changes to credit hours, required courses or anything of that nature. This only affects how track electives are listed.</p>

Substantive Change Checklist¹

Substantive change, according to the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACSCOC or SACS), is “a significant modification or expansion of the nature and scope of an accredited institution.”² Substantive change is a federal concept, based in the regulations of the U.S. Department of Education,³ which regional accreditors are required to enforce.

The University is required to submit any substantive change to SACS for review, and in some cases approval, prior to implementation of such substantive change. As noted by SACS:

“if an institution fails to follow the substantive change policy and procedures of the Commission on Colleges, it may lose its Title IV funding or be required by the U.S. Department of Education to reimburse it for money received by the institution for programs related to the unreported substantive change. In addition, the institution’s case may be referred to the Commission for the imposition of a sanction or for removal from membership.”⁴

Checklist Instructions: To ensure substantive change compliance, individuals should complete the checklist on the following pages in the early stages of any proposal (e.g. new degree program, new certificate program, etc.) or curricular revision. Upon completion, the form must be submitted to the associate provost for institutional effectiveness or designee by e-mail to InstitutionalEffectiveness@uky.edu. A determination as to whether the proposed program or changes to the existing program constitutes a substantive change will be made within seven (7) business days of receipt and next steps will be communicated accordingly.
