### Course Description: The objectives of this course are:

- 1. To teach students the fundamental mechanisms of drug delivery and clearance and how these relate to the treatment of human disease.
- 2. To provide the students with a basic understanding to the molecular mechanism of the actions of selected drugs on human disease and treatment.
- 3. To allow students to understand the tools and mechanisms involved in the science of drug discovery.
- 4. Provide students with the tools to understand how an unfamiliar drug works, when its use is indicated and when its use might be contraindicated.

#### Student Learning outcomes: This course will prepare student to be able to:

- 1. Understand how drugs work and be able to access the literature to learn how an unknown drug works, determine its efficacious use and when it might be contradicted.
- 2. Prepare for students for careers in biomedical research, health care professionals, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and other fields of study related to human health and disease.

### Grading:

*Examinations:* There will be <u>four examinations</u>. For students taking this for undergraduate credits each exam will be worth 25% of the final grade. For those students receiving graduate credit, each exam will be worth 20% of the final grade (see below).

Research paper: Graduate and Post-baccalaureate students will be required to complete a research paper on a human disease not discussed in class that details the therapeutic approaches and the mechanism of action of drugs used. This assignment will account for the remaining 20% of their grade. The research paper will be graded as a percentage of 100 and calculated in the average to derive the final grade. This will be limited to 4 pages inclusive of tables and figures but exclusive of the literature cited. Acceptable references include Goodman and Gilman's The Pharmacological Basis of Therapeutics, Twelfth Edition, pubmed and other published sources. General web references and commercial site will not be accepted. The paper must use 12-point Times font, have no more that 1" margins and use 1.5 spacing.
