Dear Dr. Randall:

We would like to submit for your review and approval, a number of changes in our College of Pharmacy graduate courses. The accompanying letter gives a brief history and rationale for these changes. With considerable help from Sheila Brothers, and a new ruling by the Senate Rules Committee that allows courses numbered between 600-799 to be deemed as the same "level", we anticipate that all the changes we are submitting now will be MINOR changes. No changes in course content or "level" are proposed; these are only prefix and numbering alterations. A similar but separate proposal for our professional courses (new departmental-based prefixes; no course content changes) is also being reviewed. Hopefully all courses in the College of Pharmacy will be altered synchronously, and in time for Fall 2009 registration.

In the Table we have noted several courses that will simply be re-prefixed for now, and will later have MAJOR change forms prepared for additional, more substantial review. In addition, we are submitting individual forms for courses in which we propose to remove prerequisites that are no longer taught. These changes lay the groundwork for a much needed updating of our curriculum. Thank you for your review. Let me know if you have questions.

**PROPOSAL TO CHANGE PREFIX AND NUMBERING OF
GRADUATE COURSES IN PHARMACEUTICAL SCIENCES**
(02/19/2009)

Background ^[1]

On July 1, 2004, the faculty of the College of Pharmacy formed two academic departments, the Department of Pharmacy Practice and Sciences (PPS) and the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences (PS). Prior to the establishment of two academic departments the faculty belonged to one formal academic department (Pharmacy, PHR) within the College of Pharmacy. Although numerous changes were undertaken in the transition to two departments, one issue that was not addressed was assignment of formal responsibility for, and designation of, course work affiliated with each department. Coursework within the university is largely the responsibility of academic departments. Because the Pharmacy Department no longer exists as a formal academic unit within the institution, the association of the prefix PHR with courses taught by two different departments within the College of Pharmacy needs to be addressed.

Presently there is one University-recognized graduate program in the College of Pharmacy, the Pharmaceutical Sciences Graduate Program. However, a separate graduate program in Pharmaceutical Outcomes and Policy is being developed by the PPS Department. The two Departments share responsibility for the Clinical and Experimental Therapeutics track that is currently within the Pharmaceutical Sciences Graduate Program.

The PS and PPS Departments are engaged in a systematic review of Pharmaceutical Sciences Graduate Program courses. One outcome of that initiative is this proposal to change both the departmental prefix and numbering system for graduate courses taught by PS and PPS to more clearly reflect the responsibility of the departments for these courses, and to further establish their identities as distinct departments within the College of Pharmacy, to both students and faculty within and external to the college.

Therefore, the following is a proposal to change the course prefix designation for graduate courses taught by Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences faculty members, from PHR to **PHS**, and to renumber courses in a more consistent, organized manner that indicates the recent partitioning of the PS department into two divisions (Drug Discovery and Drug Development). The prefix of graduate courses taught by Department of Pharmacy Practice and Science (PPS) faculty members is likewise proposed to change from PHR to **PPS**.

Professional Courses

This proposal is concerned only with graduate courses, and is coordinated with, but does not request changes in prefix or numbering of professional pharmacy student courses (800 or 900 level). Changes in professional courses are part of a separate proposal.

Overview of Proposed New Numbering

Minor Changes that are part of this current GROUPED request (see Table 1)

1. All courses in this list that are taught by PS faculty will be changed from a PHR prefix to **PHS**. Existing courses taught by PPS faculty will be changed from a PHR prefix to **PPS**.
2. Specialized courses such as Introduction to Pharmaceutical Sciences, Research, Rotations, Journal Clubs and Seminar, and the required Residency courses for graduate students who have passed their qualifying exam will utilize **PHS**, or **PPS**, **600-level numbers**.
3. Other courses, both lecture and laboratory format, will utilize **PHS**, or **PPS**, **600-level numbers**.
4. In addition, there will be a separate number range for PHS courses taught by faculty of each Division:
 - a. PHS 600-649 Drug Development
 - b. PHS 650-699 Drug Discovery

Minor Changes submitted now, as SEPARATE requests (see Table 1, bottom)

5. Three courses (noted in Yellow in Table 2) will remove Prerequisites listed in Course Bulletin that are no longer offered (e.g., 800-level courses). These courses will have Minor change forms prepared individually, not as part of the group.

Major Changes to be submitted later (see Table 2, in turquoise)

6. Four courses (noted in turquoise in Table 2) that will eventually change to their own individual course numbers will, for now, simply be re-prefixed. The Major Change forms to propose these courses will be submitted later this semester.
7. A separate request to “Remove” several courses (also noted in turquoise in Table 2) will be made later this semester. These courses have not recently been taught, and there are no plans that they will be offered in the future. Departments that cross-listed these courses have given approval for their removal (see Table). Also, remove the two Residency courses that no longer have any students who qualify.
 - a. PHR 530 Radiopharmaceutics
 - b. PHR 622 Adv Biopharmaceutics (replaced by PHS 599 Drug Delivery)
 - c. PHR 647 Intro to Molecular Pharmacotherapeutics
 - d. PHR 649 Advanced Molecular Pharmacology
 - e. PHR 768 2 semester Residency for Masters degree
 - f. PHR 769 2 semester Residency for Doctors degree
