Since its approval in May 2004, the College of Public Health has been working to strengthen its curriculum and manage its course numbers in a way to maximize the resources available. Upon examination of our course numbers, we are requesting elimination of four course numbers currently in our inventory: PM 601, PM 620, PM 651, and PM 748.

Prior to its inception, the College of Public Health was the School of Public Health and utilized course numbers in the Department of Preventive Medicine and Environmental Health, which was then a department in the College of Medicine. They were subsequently cross-listed with SPH-prefixed numbers for the School of Public Health to support the MPH curriculum. When the college was approved, these SPH prefixes became CPH prefixes and the Department of Preventive Medicine and Environmental Health was administratively moved from the College of Medicine to the College of Public Health. These changes, therefore, eliminate the need for these course numbers, but the cross-listings will remain. This would apply to course numbers PM 601, 620, and 651,

PM 748 is a zero credit-hour course that was designed to provide full-time status to students working on their thesis when the Department of Preventive Medicine and Environmental Health offered an MSPH degree, which required a formal thesis. The department no longer offers this degree and the course is therefore no longer needed.
