To facilitate interaction between students and faculty, I have listed virtual office hours and will meet by appointment via skype/facetime. To facilitate interaction among students I have provided a Piazza link on Blackboard and will encourage students to post thoughts and questions regarding the course material.

Instructor videos will be used at the beginning of each chapter to provide an overview of learning expectations. Additionally, several instructor videos will be available for each chapter to provide explanation and examples to help student comprehension of the material. Outside videos and online exercises will also be provided to help the students understand the course content.

Course Access:

This is an online course. To access the course visit http://elearning.uky.edu and login to Blackboard with your LINK **BLUE** username and password.

Course Description: An introduction to the structural and functional characteristics of the nervous system. The emphasis is on exploring the relationship between brain and behavior. Topics range from simple structures and behaviors to more complex functions. The biological basis of normal and abnormal behavior is explored from a multidisciplinary perspective.

Bb 101 for First-Time Online Students

This is a brief introduction for students using Blackboard for the first time.

- Go to http://elearning.uky.edu and log in with your Link Blue ID.
- Click on the Courses link near the top left of the page (to the right of My Bb and under the Library tab).
- In the Course Search line, type **Bb9-101** (exactly as you see it there, including the hyphen).
- Find the Course ID (first column) **Bb9-101-OnLine-Stu**, and click the down arrow next to the Course ID. Click **Enroll** then **Submit**.

Course Objectives and Student Learning Outcomes: This course offers students an overview of how the brain and other biological aspects of the body influence psychological behaviors. The course will cover the basic anatomical structure and functions of the brain and nervous system, brain development and plasticity, motivation, and cognitive and emotional disorders. Student learning will occur through assigned readings from the textbook, instructor videos, and outside videos and readings.

- 1. Learn the major anatomical and physiological components of the human nervous system
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - o Describe the organization and basic function of the central and peripheral nervous systems.
 - o Identify major structures of the brain and describe the major functions attributed to each.
- 2. Understand how biology influences human behavior
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - o Predict how damage to a specific region of the brain may impact behavior.
 - Explain the basic mechanism of action behind common drugs of abuse and how these drugs affect behavior.
 - o Describe brain pathology associated with common psychological disorders.
 - o Characterize how our individual biology shapes our sexual identification and orientation.
- 3. Understand how evolution has influenced the development of human biology and behavior
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - o Apply basic laws of evolution can be applied to understanding the development of human behavior over history.
- 4. Understand how animal research contributes to our overall understanding of human biology and behavior.
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - o Critically evaluate the benefits and limitations of animal research.
 - o Provide examples of how animal research has furthered our scientific understanding of human behavior.
 - o Demonstrate a fundamental understanding of how the anatomy and function of human and non-human brains are similar.
- 5. Evaluate the meaning and limitations of different scientific research methods.
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - O Students will be presented with news articles that report on scientific findings and asked to determine the level of accuracy in the reporting.
- 6. Apply knowledge gained in items 1.-5. to better understand common psychiatric disorders.
 - Learning Outcomes:
 - Students will be presented with case studies and asked to apply their knowledge to determine a diagnosis.

Computer Access

Exam questions may take the form of multiple choice, matching, true/false, fill in the blank questions, and/or diagram identification. Exam dates and times are currently posted in Blackboard. Students should ensure they are available during all exam windows.
